Pray For One Another

Prayer should be part of our relationships as believers. We are commanded to pray for one another in James 5. Paul reports in 2 Corinthians 1:11 that he is helped by the prayers of others.

Earlier this year I was asked to contribute to the newly formed ministry “Relentless” in Lubbock. Relentless brought in Bethany Hamilton, from *Soul Surfer* movie fame, and next month is bringing in Dr. Kevin Leman for two days in June.

I’m also now on the board for Parent Life Lubbock, a ministry of Youth For Christ. It helps teen parents to grow in their faith and to help them overcome all the challenges involved with being a teen parent.

Once I reach 100% of my support needed, My plan is to give 25% of my time to the needs of Lubbock.

I specifically want to help churches do two things.

Pray For Other Churches & Pray for Our Schools

I’m starting to talk to pastors and gathering input and support for this idea. While in Houston recently, I spoke with Marcus. He had been the youth pastor at his church for 13 years, and he shared the difference it made to have around 30 churches pray for each other over the last 20 years.

Whether the churches in Lubbock pray for other churches on Sunday morning by



having the “church of the week” listed in the bulletin, projecting it up on the big screen, or only praying for them during their staff meetings. It’s important and it needs to happen.

On a local level, we will partner with Moms in Prayer, to know which schools are being prayed for and to share prayer needs. Moms In Prayer is one of our national partners with NNYM.

Prayer & Preparing for Crisis

The first goal is to simply be able to share something along the lines of “15 churches in Lubbock are praying for 24 different schools and each other.”

We know that prayer makes a difference! Our hope is that we will share how God is working in our town in ways we often aren’t aware of - unless we are well-connected.

We deeply hope that nothing as horrible as Ferguson or Baltimore will happen in Lubbock. But if we have a similar crisis, our long-term goal - which is only reached through time and relationships - is that the body of Christ is prepared to respond

through the foundation of friendships and love across all sorts of common barriers.
